SOCIAL HEALTH

- Social Health is one of the four components of the Gladstone Harbour Report Card.
- 2. The Social Health of Gladstone Harbour was graded as a B for the fourth consecutive year.
- 3. Social Health was assessed using data collected through telephone and online surveys from 439 participants from the Gladstone Region.
- 4. THREE key indicator groups make up the grade for Social Health harbour usability, harbour access and liveability and wellbeing.
- 5. The indicators were chosen to address the report card objectives derived from a community vision.

HOW ARE SOCIAL INDICATORS MEASURED?

THREE social health indicator groups are measured to calculate scores:

- 1. **Harbour usability**: community perceptions around harbour recreational activities, air and water quality and harbour safety for human usage.
- 2. **Harbour access**: community satisfaction with access to the harbour, boat ramps and public spaces, perceptions of harbour health and barriers to harbour access.
- Liveability and wellbeing: community perceptions of harbour to liveability and wellbeing of people in Gladstone Harbour.


The indicators were chosen to address the report card objectives 'maintain or improve easy access to the harbour waters and foreshore for recreation and community uses, maintain or improve a safe harbour for all users and enhance liveability and wellbeing in the region' derived from a community vision.

WHAT DO THE GRADES MEAN?

The overall social health was rated **GOOD** in 2019, showing continued improvement from the satisfactory grade in 2014.

The **GOOD** grade indicates that the community in Gladstone region are continuing to enjoy the harbour, similar to previous years.
