The GHHP program is designed to achieve a thorough understanding of the harbour's social, cultural, economic, and environmental health through comprehensive monitoring, data gathering, and statistical analysis.

The Independent Science Panel (ISP) is crucial in this effort, offering unbiased oversight and scientific guidance. Our dedicated scientists and experts work closely with GHHP to propose methodologies, design scientific programs, and review datasets and reports for our annual report card.

The ISP is excited to contribute to GHHP's Ten Year Review through an assessment of the current science program to ensure relevancy and the ability to continue to provide a source of independent, credible, robust data. A review of the last ten years of water and sediment data is also being conducted to assess trends over time. I extend my thanks to the Port Curtis Integrated Monitoring Program (PCIMP) for the provision of this long-term data.

I am deeply grateful to the scientists, citizen scientists, and the GHHP team for their collaborative efforts to improve our understanding of harbour health, and I look forward to the next ten-years of GHHP.

GHHP LAUNCHES 2024 STEWARDSHIP report

Featuring 10 new stewardship stories and projects from our partners

The GHHP team was excited to release our 2024 Stewardship Report, titled "Above and Below," which showcases the ongoing efforts and achievements in maintaining the health of the Gladstone Harbour and surrounding ecosystems. It highlights the collective actions of local stakeholders, including government, industry, research, First Nations, and the community.

A special thanks to CQUniversity's Coastal Marine Ecosystems Research Centre (CMERC) and Gladstone Ports Corporation (GPC) for supporting the GHHP team on stage at Ecofest in June, where the Stewardship report was launched.

Key highlights from the 2024 report include:

Cleaner Roads and Waterways:

Gladstone Regional Council shares their progress in reducing sediment runoff through various initiatives, including the Cleaner Roads Runoff project and the Tigalee Creek Riparian Vegetation Restoration project.



Environmental Monitoring:

The Gladstone Air Quality Community Group continues to play a vital role in measuring air quality, using PurpleAir monitors to provide real-time data accessible to the public. Gidarjil Development Corporation rangers dive into seabird monitoring projects at North West Island.

Environmental Stewardship:

The Gladstone Ports Corporation celebrates over 110 years of environmental stewardship, with numerous long-term projects aimed at protecting marine life and enhancing biodiversity.

Environmental Caretaking:

Fitzroy Basin Association writes about their work protecting the endangered Capricorn Yellow Chat. Gladstone Ports Corporation shares how they conduct environmental surveys on Facing Island to guide caretaking activities such as pest management.

Community Engagement:

CQUniversity's CMERC showcases their work with citizen scientists to harvest seagrass flowers and lend a hand to vital research. Port Curtis Harbour Watch celebrates 10 years of providing hands-on practical scientific investigations of local waterways to schools and the community.



Innovative Initiatives:

Industry partners like Shell QGC and Rio Tinto have implemented sustainable practices and new technologies to reduce their environmental footprint and support the harbour's ecological health.

GHHP Chair, Prof. Iain Gordon, expressed gratitude for the dedication and support of all Partners involved.

GHHP TEN-YEAR review

Reviewing ten years of the Partnership, Science Program and our activities

GHHP's first Memorandum of Understanding with Partners was signed on 06 November 2013. To celebrate a decade of this committed collaboration, GHHP has been making progress conducting a review of the Partnership, the Science Program, data trends, and GHHP activities.

The first step in the process was to host an Alluvium Consulting facilitated workshop on 20 November 2023, following a survey completed by Partners. Thank you to everyone who took the time to complete the survey and participate in the workshop, including community, Partners, and members of the Independent Science Panel.

GHHP is informed by open, transparent, and independent peer-reviewed science, through an Independent Science Panel (ISP). The role of the ISP is to provide independent scientific advice on the monitoring program that supports the Gladstone Harbour Report Card. For the Ten-Year Review, the ISP is assessing the current Science Program to ensure relevancy, efficiency, and effectiveness of GHHP monitoring. The Review also provides an opportunity for the ISP to more formally assess data and trend stability over time. This includes the review of water quality and sediment data provided by the Port Curtis Integrated Monitoring Program (PCIMP).

Finally, the effectiveness, sustainability, and reliability of the Partnership will be assessed through the biennial What's Our Grade report, facilitated by Darwinian Consulting. It aims to help the Partnership assess its level of adaptability and identify areas for improvement. A survey will be undertaken to inform a final grade for GHHP, and to provide a detailed assessment of results and recommendations.

A final synthesis report, developed by the GHHP team, will provide a detailed overview of each of the four components of the Ten-Year Review. The synthesis report, with recommendations for the future, will be presented at the GHHP Partners meeting on 7 November 2024.
